

READING

Word reading

- 1. I can match all 40+ graphemes to their phonemes.
- 2. I can blend sounds in unfamiliar words.
- 3. I can divide words into syllables.
- 4. I can read compound words.
- 5. I can read words with contractions and understand that the apostrophe represents the missing letters.
- 6. I can read phonetically decodable words.
- 7. I can read words that end with 's, -ing, -ed, -est
- 8. I can read words which start with un-.
- 9. I can add -ing, -ed and -er to verbs. (Where no change is needed to the root word)
- 10. I can read words of more than one syllable that contain taught GPCs.

Comprehension

- 11. I can say what I like and do not like about a text.
- 12. I can link what I have heard or read to my own experiences.
- 13. I can retell key stories orally using narrative language.
- 14. I can talk about the main characters within a well known story.
- 15. I can learn some poems and rhymes by heart.
- 16. I can use what I already know to understand texts.
- 17. I can check that my reading makes sense and go back to correct when it doesn't.
- 18. I can draw inferences from the text and/or the illustrations. (Beginning)
- 19. I can make predictions about the events in the text.
- 20. I can explain what I think a text is about.

WRITING

<u>Spelling</u>

Transcription

- 1. I can identify known phonemes in unfamiliar words.
- 2. I can use syllables to divide words when spelling.
- 3. I use what I know about alternative phonemes to narrow down possibilities for accurate spelling.
- 4. I can use the spelling rule for adding 's' or 'es' for verbs in the 3rd person singular.
- 5. I can name all the letters of the alphabet in order.
- 6. I can use letter names to show alternative spellings of the same phoneme.

<u>Handwriting</u>

- 7. I can sit correctly at a table, holding a pencil comfortable and correctly.
- 8. I can form lower case letters in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place.
- 9. I can form capital letters and digits 0-9.

Composition

- 10. I can compose a sentence orally before writing it.
- 11. I can sequence sentences in chronological order to recount and event or experience.
- 12. I can re-read what I have written to check that it makes sense.
- 13. I leave spaces between words.
- 14. I know how the prefix 'un' can be added to words to change meaning.
- 15. I can use the suffixes 's', 'es', 'ed', and 'ing' within my writing.

Grammar and punctuation

Sentence structure

- 16. I can combine words to make a sentence.
- 17. I can join two sentences using 'and'.

Text structure

18. I can sequence sentences to form a narrative.

Punctuation

- 19. I can separate words using finger spaces.
- 20. I can use capital letters to start a sentence.
- 21. I can use a full stop to end a sentence.
- 22. I can use a question mark.
- 23. I can use an exclamation mark.
- 24. I can use capital letters for names.
- 25. I can use 'I'.

MATHS

Number and place value

- 1. I can count to and across 100, forward and backwards ,beginning with 0 or 1 from any number.
- 2. I can count in multiples of 2, 5 and 10.
- 3. I can count, read and write numbers to 100 in numerals.
- 4. I can say what is one more or one less than any number.
- 5. I can read and write numbers from 1 to 20 in numerals and words.
- 6. I can identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations including the number line and use the language of: equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most least

Calculations

- 7. I can represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts to 20.
- 8. I can add and subtract 1-digit and 2-digit numbers to 20, including zero.
- 9. I can read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition, subtraction and equals signs.
- 10. I can solve one-step problems that involve addition and subtraction, using objects and pictorial representations.
- 11. I can solve missing number problems.
- 12. I can solve one-step problems involving multiplication and division, by using concrete objects, pictorial representations and arrays.

Fractions

- 13. I can recognise, find and name a half of an object, shape or quantity.
- 14. I can recognise, find and name a quarter of an object, shape or quantity.

Measurement

- 15. I can compare, describe and solve practical problems for lengths and heights; mass/weight; capacity and volume; and time.
- 16. I can measure and begin to record lengths and heights; mass/weight; capacity and volume; and time.
- 17. I recognise and know the value of different denominations of coins and notes.
- 18. I can tell the time to the hour.
- 19. I can tell the time to half past the hour.
- 20. I can draw hands on a clock face to show these times.
- 21. I can sequence events in chronological order using language.
- 22. I recognise and use language relating to dates, including days, weeks, months and years

Geometry - properties of shapes

- 23. I recognise and can name common 2D shapes (rectangles, including squares, circles and triangles.
- 24. I recognise and can name common 3D shapes (cuboids, including cubes, pyramids and spheres

Geometry - position and direction

25. I can describe position, directions and movement, including half, quarter and three-quarter turns.
